In the evening the same day, Chair Wu Hsian-lo invited all the participants to the dinner party. The supervisor of Chuo GAKUIN University Kitahara has acquired the sixduan qualification in ken-do. During the visit to TKU, he attentively watched the performance of TKU's ken-do team.
