FOREIGN STUDENTS DON'T WORRY ABOUT PRESENTATIONS IN CHINESE

The Center for Learning and Teaching and the Office of International Exchanges and International Education jointly offered a 3-week Workshop on Learning Strategies for foreign students which started on March 2. Hopefully it will help foreign students overcome difficulties in presentations and written assignments in Chinese.

Wei-ying Chang said that all participants were very active in discussion. She hoped to have helped them with presentation skills. Chinese freshman Marla Jean Hill said, "Although it is the first class like this, I have understand it well." Most of the participants wished that TKU could offer a workshop on how to use both the hardware and software of the TKU library to help them make good use of the library resources. Besides, master sophomore Kuninaga Mivhiko at the Graduate Institute of Japan Studies pointed out that if TKU could open a Chinese Corner for foreign students and sign some Chinese instructors to help, they would make faster progress in Chinese.
