DR. LEE OU-FAN, ACADEMICIAN OF ACADEMIA SINICA, GAVE A SPEECH ON LITERATURE AND MUSIC

Invited by College of Foreign Languages and Literatures (CFLL), Dr. Lee Ou-fan, Academician of Academia Sinica, Taiwan, delivered a speech "The Aesthetics of Modernism: Literature and Arts" at Chueh-sheng International Conference Hall on May 4 to discuss the role of music in literary works.
