OVERSEAS CHINESE STUDENTS SHOWCASE THEIR 'HOME CUISINE'

Whoever wants to enjoy exotic foods, and experience different cultures at the same time should not miss the 2004 Overseas Chinese Culture Week held this week at the Exhibition Hall of the Business and Management Building. This event is organized by the Overseas Chinese Student Guidance Section and the Overseas Students Club, who intend to take all the visitors on a journey to an exotic culinary and cultural landscape.

The overseas students participating in the Culture Week event are from seven countries—Malaysia, Indonesia, Burma, Hong Kong, Macao, South Africa and Korea representing 6 regions.
